Phonics

We will keep practising the sounds that we've learnt (linking them to the picture card that the letter looks like. We are really, really practising our rhyming—you could do this at home too by reading rhyming stories and getting your child to finish the rhyme. You could also keep popping rhyming words into conversation. To make it easier to hear the rhyme you could say 'cat, cat rhymes with hhhh...at' and encourage your child to say hat. Our song of the week next week will be '1,2,3,4,5 once I caught a fish alive'.
