



### PE Funding Action Plan – Impact of 2016/17 Budget

The Sports Premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. At Park Spring Primary we intend to use the funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of. A focus will be on developing staff knowledge and expertise to ensure that following funding, the aims and objectives will continue to be sustainable. The following objectives provide our focus for allocating funding each year.
