

Year 6 Spellings Autumn 1 - to also use the year 3 and 4 list, check the ones we need to re-learn.

Week 1 (high frequency vocabulary - to include words incorrectly spelt from this week)

favourite, friend, they're, their, there, your, you're, recommend, exaggerate, accommodate, appreciate, guarantee, thorough, through, conscience, environment.

Grammar: Past tense - regular and irregular verbs, proof reading for errors.

Week 3 test (revise 3/4 spelling list)

eight, eighth, calendar, different, difficult, disappear, exercise, height, island, length - spot test of year 3/4 list.

Grammar: Re-cap of word classes - verb, adverb, adjective, noun, determiners: articles, possessives, demonstratives, quantifiers etc - [http://english-the-easy-way.com/Determiners/What\\_Are\\_Determiners.htm](http://english-the-easy-way.com/Determiners/What_Are_Determiners.htm)

Week 2 test (words with ei and ie)

protein, caffeine, seize deceive/deceit, conceive, receive, perceive, ceiling, beige, heist, perceive, achieve, fierce, relief, believe, pierce, shriek etc.

Grammar: Passive and active sentences, word classes.

A sentence is written in active voice when the subject of the sentence performs the action in the sentence. e.g. The girl was eating the cake. A sentence is written in passive voice when the subject of the sentence has an action done to it by someone or something else - e.g. The cake was eaten by the girl.

Week 3 test (revise the -ible, -able suffixes)

available, breakable, visible, audible, acceptable, amicable, forgettable, readable, bearable, advisable, measurable, comfortable etc.

Grammar: Synonyms and antonyms. Synonyms - similar meanings: tepid, warm, lukewarm. Antonyms opposite meanings e.g. hot/cold.

Week 4 test (word containing -fer )

refer, referring, referral, preferring, preferred, transfer, transferring, reference, referee, preference, transfer, transference.

Grammar: Writing using colons, semi-colons, hyphens and dashes.

Week 5 test (revise 3/4 spelling list)

Random selection from the list based on the class needs - practise the ones you find hard to remember.

Grammar: Complex sentences, objects and subjects.

Week 6 test (ough words and proof reading for spelling and grammar mistakes)

dough, enough, though, cough, tough, rough, hiccough, trough, bough etc.

Grammar: Word classes - adjective (comparative/superlative), noun types (common, proper etc), determiners, verbs, adverbs.

Week 7

Test of words learnt so far, use of apostrophes for contraction/possession - random selection/words the class find challenging.

Grammar: Re-cap of grammar learnt this term.
