Week 1

Test of last term's spellings and common spelling errors.

Grammar: Re-cap of word classes, verb, noun, adverb and adjectives - types of nouns, verbs and adjectives.

Grammar: Active and passive sentences - subjects and objects in sentences.

Week 3 (Test- words ending in y preceded by a consonant change y to ie when adding a suffix, e.g. flies, tried - except for the suffixes ly or ing, e.g. slyly, flying)
