Phonics

Maths

We are continuing working on our numbers to three and recognising numerals to three. We will be singing number rhymes to 10 We will be reading Stick man BY Julia Donaldson and comparing lengths, using the vocabulary long, longer, longest. Short shorter shortest. We will be looking at triangles and counting how many sides they have. Please look for triangle shapes around the house and on the way to and from school.

Literacy

Our story for the last two weeks has been Stick Man by Julia Donaldson. We will be continuing looking at the book and talking about the story and the main characters. We will be listening for rhyming words and talking about beginning middle and end of the story.
