


## Suggested home learning timetable for Reception



An owl is up at night.	Build a castle den.  Role play the characters e.g. the giant, Jack. Act out the story. Can you do 13 hops, jumps, claps, star jumps? What else can you do?</p> <p>Key sentence: <b>“Thirteen is one ten and three ones. “</b></p>	<p>Learn the trigraph (three letters that make one sound) <b>ear</b>.</p> <p>Search on Youtube – <i>Geraldine the Giraffe learns /ear/ sound</i> and watch</p>	<p>Read the ‘ear’ words: Dear, fear, gear, near, year, hear, beard, rear. You may want to write on ‘sound buttons’ for each word, eg.: dear</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• -----</li> </ul>	<p>Write a list of ear words. Can you write one in a sentence?</p>	<p>Find a big shoe. Use it to measure things around your house. What things are longer than the shoe? What things are shorter than the shoe? You could draw them in your book.</p> <p>Draw pictures to show how your seed is growing. Write the name of each day on the picture when you draw it.</p>	<p>9 am Joe Wicks (PE) Or Cosmic yoga Or Go Noodle (You tube)</p> <p>List 5 things you are good at.</p>
<b>Tuesday</b>	<p>Can you count forwards to 13, then backwards? Try it in silly voices! Can you write numbers in order to 13? (You could even make number stepping stones to jump on!). Can you arrange the toys to show 13 in lots of different ways? For example: 10 toys in a row, then 3.</p>	<p>Play Buried Treasure on Phonics Play. Can you re-tell the main events? What happens at the beginning/middle/end? (Use the reading questions provided in the initial Learning Pack sent).</p>	<p>Draw a picture of your favourite toy/character/superhero and write about it.</p>	<p>Drawing doesn't always have to look like something, it can just be for relaxation.</p> <p>Pretend you are climbing a mountain (up the stairs). What would you need to pack for the journey?
