Year 2 had a super day! We shared 2 stories and did lots of activities around them. We made book marks and story characters, puppets, went on a book scavenger hunt and read to our pets! We even made up our own funny story and read it in assembly on TEAMS at the end of the day.



Year 1 Remote Learners read 'What the Ladybird Heard' and children looked at the rhyming words, what animals they would have in their farm and created their own wanted posters. Children choose activities and then shared what they had been doing with everyone. We made bookmarks, egg characters, letters to the Gruffalo and paper dolls!



Year 6 remote learners have had a great day today for World Book Day. We've been reading Shackleton's Journey, which tells the incredible true story of Ernest Shackleton's expedition to Antarctica in 1914. The children have created some Antarctica art work based on the book, as well as writing diary entries and planning their luggage for the trip! In addition to this, they've enjoyed choosing from the variety of other 'pick and mix' activities available and creating some lovely learning. Well done Year 6!



Year 5 have been Reading Beetle Boy, so they spent the afternoon in the nature garden hunting for bugs, building a bug hotel and creating spaces for beetles and bugs to live.



Reception had a great day celebrating World Book Day, diving into the story The Dinosaur that Pooped a Planet! We started the day by reading the story, then we watched a special live broadcast by the people that organise World Book Day and saw the author, Tom Fletcher, perform a song as well as trying to draw a cow and a ladybird like Lydia Monk, the illustrator. The children celebrated in class and at home. They created rockets and imagined where it would fly to, made playdough dinosaur characters, made their very own bookmarks and enjoyed lots of stories throughout the day. We even got to see our friends on Zoom and share a story with them!
