E.g. in a discussion about vegetarianism, rather than saying 'my mum is a vegetarian so eating meat is wrong' to be able to say 'lots of people don't eat meat because they believe killing animals is cruel'.</li> <li>To identify when a discussion is going off topic and to be able to bring it back on track (through use of discussion roles).</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Cognitive</li> <li>To construct a detailed argument or complex narrative.</li> <li>To spontaneously respond to increasingly complex questions, citing evidence where appropriate.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Social and emotional</li> <li>Listen for extended periods of time.</li> <li>To speak with flair and confidence.</li> <li>Begin to use humour.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Social and emotional         <ul> <li>To use humour effectively.</li> <li>To select an appropriate method of delivery.
