	8	sketching	A loose line drawing that is created quickly without worrying about total accuracy. Sketches can be done to prepare for later work.
	9	colour wash	Is a thin coat of water-based paint using long sweeping strokes.
	10	pinch	A process where the clay walls are thinned by pinching them with thumb and forefinger.
100	11	roll	Clay can be rolled flat with a rolling pin or into a cylindrical shape with the flat of a hand.
