Noah's Arc		God flooded the world because there were too many wicked people in it. After the flood, Noah, his family, and the animals emerged from the ark; and Noah worshiped God. God promised Noah He would never destroy the earth with a flood, and He placed a rainbow in the sky as a symbol of His promise.
