Attach— Attach means to connect two things	Step 3— Construct the pop up section by cutting a rectangular shape and adding two tabs.

Fold—A bend in the paper, leaving the card layered on top or over another.	Step 5— Draw and cut out an image.Step 6—Attach the image to the pop out section.

Step 7—Add a design to the front cover of the card.
